Running the Race of Faith

Hebrews 12:1-3 (NKJV)

"Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ²looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls.

Introduction

Am I running, walking, standing, stumbling, or quitting the race?

Background

• So Great a Cloud of Witnesses (v. 1a)

- It is composed of many, more than just the 18 specifically mentioned in Hebrews 11.

- That cloud includes great men and women of God who have come since Hebrews 11, known and unknown to history.

- **Heroes of faith in the past:** their faithfulness is a constant encouragement that surrounds us.

- These witnesses are not witnessing us as we conduct our lives. Instead, they are witnesses to us of faith and endurance in all they have lived and experienced.

- We do not struggle alone, and we are not the first to struggle with the problems we face.

- Others have run the race and won, and their witness stirs us to run and win also.

As believers of Christ, we need to run the race set by God before us:

I. Lay Aside

A. Every weight that hinders us (v. 1b): these keep us from running effectively.

1. Mind's thoughts – no plans, self-centered plans, "no one sees", bad past, busyness, "next time"
2. Heart's desires – no desires, self-centered desires, materialistic
3. Mouth's words – no words, negative words

B. Sin that easily ensnares us (v. 1c): from ancient Greek word "euperistaton", which can be translated as "easily avoided", "admired", "ensnaring", or "dangerous".

1. Mind's thoughts – self-centeredness, envy, laziness, doubts, pride, self-glory, idols
2. Heart's desires – ungratefulness, love of money, greed, hatred, lust, unforgiveness
3. Mouth's words – lies, gossips, "paninira", curses, broken promises, broken covenant

II. Run with Edurance

Endurance translates from the ancient Greek word "hupomone", which does not mean the patience which sits down and accepts things but the patience which masters them. It is a determination, unhurrying and yet undelaying, which goes steadily on and refuses to be deflected.

A. Our race is set by God before us. (v. 1d):

1. Race, from ancient Greek word "agona", is a word used for conflict or struggle of many kinds.
2. We must run this race, and it will involve effort and commitment. Being passive never runs or wins a race. God wants us to run the race and to finish it right.

Having the same conflict which you

saw in me
and now hear
is in me.

1 Timothy 6:12

Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

2 Timothy 4:7

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.

B. Run to get the prize.

1 Corinthians 9:24

Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it.

Philippians 3:13-14

¹³Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, ¹⁴I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

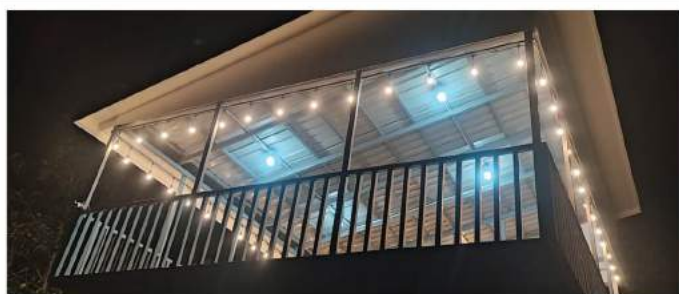

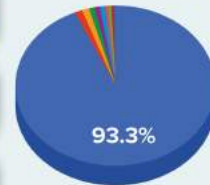

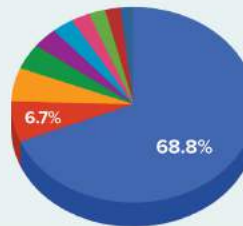

The Journey of Christian Life

Ang isang larawan ng madilim na bahagi ng mga tao ay ang paglalakbay patungo sa Promised Land. Lumabas ang mga Israelite sa pamumuno ni Moses papuntang Egypt. Sa kanilang paglalayag patungo sa Promised Land ay maraming nangyaring problema. Dahil ang mga tao sa Israel ay matitigas ang ulo at puro reklamo, dinala sila sa disyerto kung saan may kakapusan sa pagkain at tubig. Dumating sa punto na sila ay nagutom at nauhaw kung kaya't nagreklamo sila kay Moses. And what Moses did was he cried to God. Dinala sila sa isang balon na ang tawag ay Mara. Ang ibig sabihin ng Mara ay "mapait" kaya hindi nila puwedeng inumin ang tubig sa balong iyon. And so, Moses cried out to God, then He pointed Moses to a tree. Ang puno na iyon ang kinuha ni Moses at inihagis doon sa balon at naging matamis ang tubig.

WHY DO WE UNDERGO TRANSFORMATION, TESTING, AND TRIALS? ANG LAHAT NG ITO AY DINADAANAN NATIN UPANG TAYO AY LUMAKAS AT MAGING MATATAG SA ATING PANANAMPALATAYA.

Ang katigasan ng ulo natin ang nagdudulot sa atin ng problema. Kapag sinuway natin ang Diyos, marami ang mangyayari sa atin na hindi natin inaakala. Just like the Israelites, they murmured and they complained. Huwag tayong ganoon. When we keep on murmuring and complaining, we cannot go smoothly in our journey. Mabuti na lamang ay hindi nanatili na masadlak sa kasalanan ang mga tao. Dumating ang oras na ang Diyos din ang gumawa ng paraan kung paano ba makakalagpas ang tao sa kaniyang kasalanan. Siya rin ang nagbigay ng kaligtasan.

THE TRIALS THAT WE FACE ARE NOT TO HARM US. THOSE TRIALS ARE INTENDED TO MAKE US STRONG AND TO MAKE OUR FAITH STRONG.

The Father sent His Son. Pinadala Niya ang kaisa-isa Niyang Anak. It is said in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life." Ang Diyos natin ay sadyang maibigin. Hindi Niya pinabayaan ang tao na masadlak sa kasalanan. Kung hindi Niya gagawin iyon, walang sinoman sa atin ang makakarating sa pinakamimithi nating buhay—buhay na walang hanggan. Jesus died for us. He redeemed us.

Noong tinanggap natin si Hesu Kristo bilang Panginoon at Tagapagligtas natin, naging mabuti ang ating kalagayan. Kaya nandito na tayo sa pangalawang yugto. Gustuhin man natin o hindi, lahat tayo ay dadanas ng pagsubok at paghihirap. Walang sinoman sa atin ang hindi dadaan diyan. Dahil si Hesus mismo ay naghirap, kabahagi din tayo sa Kaniyang paghihirap. Ang isang magandang halimbawa diyan ay ang buhay ni Apostle Paul. Dati, mamamatay-tao siya, hanggang isang araw ay kinatagpo siya ng Panginoon. Mula noon ay nagkaroon ng pagbabago ang kaniyang buhay. Hindi na siya mamamatay-tao ng mga mananampalataya bagkus ay naging tagapangaral na siya ng Salita ng Diyos.

Alam natin ang paghihirap na dinanas ni Apostle Paul. Kinulong siya at hindi lang basta ikinulong, kung hindi pati mga paa at kamay niya ay nakakadena at hinagupit ng latay sa kaniyang katawan. Kung ikaw ang nasa kaniyang situwasyon, magagawa mo pa kayang magpuri sa Panginoon? Kung titingnan natin ang buhay ni Paul, napakahirap nito. He almost died because of the hardships he went through. But he did not give up and he continued. Kahit nasa loob siya ng kulungan ay patuloy pa rin siya sa pangangaral ng Salita ng Diyos. Hindi siya nasiraan ng loob dahil sa kaniyang dinanas na hirap, kung hindi ay nagawa

niya pang magalak. Why do we undergo transformation, testing, and trials? Ang lahat ng ito ay dinadaan natin upang tayo ay lumakas at maging matatag sa ating pananampalataya. Katulad na lamang ng isang ginto. Ang ginto ay dumadaan sa pinakamainit na apoy na kapag ito ay natunaw, lahat ng mga dumi ay naalis, kaya nagiging puro ang ginto. Ganoon din tayong mga Kristiyano. Dumadaan tayo sa mga pagsubok at iba't ibang klase ng problema upang tayo ay lalong maging matatag at lalong lumago ang ating pananampalataya. That is why the trials that we face are not to harm us.

Those trials are intended to make us strong and to make our faith strong. Kapag ikaw ay isang Kristiyano, hindi ibig sabihin ay wala ka nang problema. Hindi ito ang ipinangako ng Panginoon. God promised not to forsake us and not to leave us.

LIFE THEN, LIFE NOW

NEW COVENANT

In the Old Testament, God declared to the people of Israel that He will make a new covenant with them and with the people of Judah (Jeremiah 31:31). He promised that it will be different from the old covenant that they have broken. The new covenant that God has promised was that He will put His law in their minds and write it on their hearts; and He will be their God and they shall be His people. They shall all know the Lord from the least of them to the greatest. And what all the people should be grateful for is that He will forgive their iniquity, and He will remember their sin no more (Jeremiah 31:2-34).

In the New Testament, in the Book of Matthew, Jesus was having a supper with His disciples as a celebration of the Passover feast. ²⁶And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." ²⁷Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. ²⁸For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins ²⁹But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom." (Matthew 26:26-29).

Jesus fulfilled the covenant God has made to the people of Israel, wherein He made His disciples remember the bread as His body and the wine which is the blood of the new covenant which will be sacrificed for the forgiveness of the sins of man. And God made salvation available for us that if we confess with our mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in our heart that God raised Him from the dead, we will be saved. III. Look unto Jesus

This means fixing our eyes on Jesus. We can only run the race as we look to Jesus and have our eyes locked on to Him. He is our focus, our inspiration, and our example.

A. Jesus is the author and finisher of our faith. (v. 2a)

Philippians 1:6

Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ.

B. Jesus endured the hardship.

1. Jesus endured the cross. (v. 2b)

- Jesus kept His tongue.
- Jesus kept His course.
- Jesus kept His progress.
- Jesus kept His joy.
- Jesus kept His love.

2. Jesus despised the shame. (v. 2c)

- Jesus bore a shameful accusation: blasphemy.
- Jesus bore shameful mocking.
- Jesus bore shameful beating.
- Jesus wore a shameful crown.
- Jesus wore a shameful robe.
- Jesus bore shameful mocking even as He prayed on the cross.

3. Jesus sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (v. 2d)

- This speaks of Jesus' glorification.
- The same promise of being glorified (though in a different sense) after our shame is true for the Christian.

C. Will make you not grow weary and lose heart. (v. 3b)

John 16:33

"These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

1 Thessalonians 5:24

He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it.
