John 15:12-17 (NKJV)

¹²This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. 13Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. 14You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. ¹⁵No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you. 16 You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you. ¹⁷These things I command you, that you love one another.

Introduction

In the Bible, God and the Lord Jesus call certain individuals their friends, but no human ever refers to God or Jesus as their friend. It is not a mutual, reciprocal friendship. The Bible refers to both Abraham (2 Chronicles 20:7; Isaiah 41:8; James 2:23) and Moses (Exodus 33:11) as friends of God. Jesus calls the disciples His friends, but He is still their Lord and Teacher (John 13:13, 14).

In reality, Jesus is not automatically our friend or everyone's friend. The Bible teaches that by nature, we are all God's enemies because He is holy and we all have sinned (Romans 8:7; James 4:4; 1 Peter 5:5). But the good news is that God sent Jesus to reconcile rebellious sinners to Himself.

2 Corinthians 5:18-19

¹⁸Now all things are of God, who

has
reconciled
us to Himself
through Jesus
Christ, and has
given us the ministry
of reconciliation, ¹⁹that
is, that God was in Christ
reconciling the world to Himself,
not imputing their trespasses to
them, and has committed to us the
word of reconciliation.

Luke 5:31-32

³¹Jesus answered and said to them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ³²I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance."

The first step to be called a friend of Jesus is to come to Him as a helpless sinner, to accept Him as your Lord and Savior, and to believe that He is the only way, the truth, and the life. Once you have done that, then you can consider these characteristics of Jesus' friends and seek to grow in them.

These are the four characteristics of those whom Jesus calls His friends.

1. Love one another just as He loved us (John 15:12-13, 17).

John 13:34-35

³⁴A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

Jesus repeats this command on the same night because He wanted them to remember this one thing—love is not optional for those who follow Jesus.

A. Jesus' love for us is the standard for our love for one another.

Jesus' love is "self-sacrificing, caring commitment that shows itself in seeking the highest good of the one loved." The highest good for all people is that they would have their sins forgiven and receive eternal life through faith in Jesus Christ. And once a person has come to know Christ, his highest good is that he be conformed to the image of Christ. Those goals should be our aim in all of our relationships.

The Bible commands certain feelings, for example, "Rejoice always" (1 Thessalonians 5:16), or "Be anxious for nothing" (Philippians 4:6). But love is primarily a commitment and not a feeling. It is a caring commitment and people should feel our genuine feelings of love for them. But even when we don't feel especially loving, we need to obey God by sacrificing ourselves for the sake of others.

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.

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Friends of Jesus

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I am sure that the cross did not feel good at that moment, but Jesus endured it because He was focused on the future joy of having us with Him in heaven for all eternity.

Jesus says, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends." We know that Jesus not only died for His friends but also for the sinners (Romans 5:8-10). We can never do what Jesus did on the cross, but in comparison, there are many heroic deeds happening every day, like saving someone from drowning or rescuing someone inside a burning building. Some would donate their blood or their organs to a complete stranger. Some would nurse someone to health or treat their injuries. In the simplest act, these self-sacrifices on a daily basis are what Jesus intends for us to do when He said, "Love one another."

B. Abide in Christ's love to love one another.

John 15:9-10

⁹"As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love. ¹⁰If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love."

Abiding in God's love is the key to loving one another.

Matthew 22:37-39

³⁷Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"

Without abiding in God's love, our

fallen love is selfishness.

James 4:1-4

¹Where do wars and fights come from among you? Do they not come from your desires for pleasure that war in your members? ²You lust and do not have. You murder and covet and cannot obtain. You fight and war. Yet you do not have because you do not ask. ³You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures. ⁴Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

When we abide in God's love, the fruits are self-sacrifice and loving one another.

2. Obey His commandments (John 15:14).

Some have thought that by obeying Jesus' commands, they will become His friends. Remember that we must abide in His love first before we can obey. The nature of Jesus' friend is obedience, rather than earning His friendship through obedience.

Mark 3:33-35

³³But He answered them, saying, "Who is My mother, or My brothers?" ³⁴And He looked around in a circle at those who sat about Him, and said, "Here are My mother and My brothers! ³⁵For whoever does the will of God is My brother and My sister and mother."

3. Understand the truths that He made known to us from the Father (John 15:15).

Jesus is our Lord and Savior, and we are His servants. When Jesus said, "No longer do I call you servants", it does not mean that we are no longer His servants but rather, even though we are still His servant, we are treated as friend and shared

with us necessary truths.

Later, Jesus told the disciples that He has many more things to tell them, but they could not bear them yet (John 16:12). Then after the resurrection, He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures (Luke 24:45).

Now we have the Holy Spirit and the Spirit-inspired Word of God to reveal to us all that we need to know for life and godliness (John 14:26; 16:13; 1 Corinthians 2:9-13; 2 Peter 1:3-4).

4. Chosen by Him to bear fruit that remains as they depend upon Him through prayer (John 15:16)

A. Chosen by God

Some may say, "I was saved because I choose Jesus." Let us be clear, we did not choose God, but God through Jesus Christ have chosen us. The Father drew us to His Son and opened our eyes.

1 Corinthians 1:27-29

²⁷But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty; ²⁸and the base things of the world and the things which are despised God has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are, ²⁹that no flesh should glory in His presence.

B. Bear fruit that remains.

To bear fruit that remains means that by abiding in Christ's love, we will bear fruit. The fruit mentioned here is not good works, but a lost sheep, who through the proclamation of the gospel, was also called and chosen (saved by grace through faith). One of the reasons that God chose to save us is to help bring others (lost sheep) to Christ. Paul suffered so that God's

elect would hear the gospel and be saved. That should be our aim as well.

2 Timothy 2:10

Therefore I endure all things for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

While it is good to receive trainings and seminars about sharing your faith, we always need to keep in mind that salvation is not through sales-talk to close the deal. Only God can produce fruits who abide.

John 1:12-13

¹²But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: ¹³who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

C. Praver

Prayer is the God-given necessity behind evangelism. Before you talk to a person about God, talk to God about the person. God sent us to preach the gospel.

Conclusion

So, would Jesus call you His friend? He would, if you are loving others, especially those in your home and in the church. He would, if you are seeking to obey His commandments. He would, if you are growing to understand the truths revealed by the Holy Spirit in God's Word. And He would, if you know that He chose you to bear fruit that remains and you are seeking to bear that fruit through prayer.

How do I know if God has chosen me? "Have you believed in Jesus as your Lord and Savior?" If you have, that didn't come from you! You believed in Him because in love He chose you before the foundation of the world. That way, He gets all the glory!
