



# Jesus: The Chief Cornerstone

## 2 Peter 2:4-10 (NKJV)

4Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, 5you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 'Therefore it is also contained in the Scripture, "Behold, I lay in Zion a chief cornerstone, elect, precious, and he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame." 'Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, "The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone." 8and "A stone of stumbling and a rock of offense." They stumble, being disobedient to the word, to which they also were appointed. 9But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; 10who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy.

#### Introduction

# What is a cornerstone?

- A cornerstone is the first stone set in the construction of a masonry foundation. All other stones will be set in reference to this stone, thus determining the position of the entire structure.
- A chief cornerstone is placed above two walls to keep them together and to prevent the building from falling apart.

In the Scripture, Jesus is the chief cornerstone while the apostles and the prophets are the foundation.

#### Ephesians 2:19-22

<sup>19</sup>Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, <sup>20</sup>having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, <sup>21</sup>in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, <sup>22</sup>in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

# **Believers as Spiritual House**

Just like Jesus, "the living stone," we who put our faith and trust in Him are living stones being built up as spiritual house, dwelling place of our almighty and loving God.

In the Old Testament, the chosen people of God (Israel) built the tabernacle and the temple to be the dwelling place for God and to serve also as meeting place for His chosen priest/servant to receive messages and blessings for the people.

But when Jesus came and sacrificed Himself on the cross, God made a new dwelling for Him with Christ as the chief cornerstone.

### Jesus as our Chief Cornerstone

As spiritual houses of God, Jesus is our chief cornerstone.

Jesus is our chief cornerstone (reference) for obedience to God.

#### John 6:38

For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me.

# Philippians 2:8

And being found

in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross,

 It was already remarkable that God the Son would take human form, leaving His deity, and enter into our broken world.

 But Jesus went farther, much farther, becoming obedient to the will of the Father even to the point of death, even death on the cross.

 At that time, crucifixion is a death sentence; not only that, it is the ultimate undignified way to die, not to mention the excruciating physical pain that Jesus endured.

• But because of this, God highly exalted Jesus and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, that by His name salvation might come to us and at His name every knee shall bow (Philippians 2:9-10).

Jesus is our chief cornerstone (reference) for love and compassion.



# Jesus is our chief cornerstone (reference) for forgiveness.

#### Luke 23:34a

Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

# Jesus is our chief cornerstone (reference) for humility.

#### Philippians 2:5-8

<sup>5</sup>Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup>who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, <sup>7</sup>but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup>And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross.

### We are the holy temple of God.

Because Jesus is our chief cornerstone, we are also sanctified and we become righteous and holy because of Him.

Jesus is both the Holy One and "the one" who makes people holy.

Jesus is our righteousness, holiness, and redemption.

#### 1 Corinthians 1:30

But of Him you are in Christ Jesus,

who became for us wisdom from God—and righteousness and sanctification and redemption.

Jesus' perfect life and sacrificial death satisfied God's holy wrath against sinners. We have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

#### Hebrews 10:10

By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

In the Old Testament, when priests entered the temple, specifically the Most Holy Place, they were made holy by consecration rituals involving atonement, purification, and eating special meal.

These same elements also underlie the Passover rituals, by which God consecrated Israel as a holy nation.

Same thing today, because of Jesus, we believers, who are chosen by God and who have put our faith and trust in Him, become a holy priesthood, a holy nation, and God's special possession (1 Peter 2:5-9).

Apart from Jesus, holiness, sanctification, and righteousness are impossible for us.

#### Command to be Holy

As His temple, God commands us to be holv.

#### 1 Peter 1:15-16

<sup>15</sup>but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, <sup>16</sup>because it is written, "Be holy, for I am holy."

As His holy temple, we must

worship God by offering our bodies as "living sacrifice."

#### Romans 12:1 (ESV)

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Since we are God's holy (exclusive) possession, we must reflect God's moral character with holy and godly lives.

#### 1 Thessalonians 4:3-7

<sup>3</sup>For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from sexual immorality; <sup>4</sup>that each of you should know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, <sup>5</sup>not in passion of lust, like the Gentiles who do not know God; <sup>6</sup>that no one should take advantage of and defraud his brother in this matter, because the Lord is the avenger of all such, as we also forewarned you and testified. <sup>7</sup>For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in holiness.

# Jesus as a Stumbling Block and Rock of Offense

While Jesus is the chief cornerstone of those chosen by God, He is also a stumbling block and rock of offense to those who are disobedient to His word and those who rejected Him.

#### Isaiah 8:14-15

<sup>14</sup>He will be as a sanctuary, but a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense to both the houses of Israel, as a trap and a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem. <sup>15</sup>And many among them shall stumble; they shall fall and be broken, be snared and taken."

#### Matthew 21:44

And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder.

Why is Jesus a stumbling block and stone of offense?

- They stumble because they are disobedient of His Word.
- Christ's claim (His resurrection and exclusive role as Savior) is offensive to those who are invested in religious system or political powers of the day (both in Jesus' time and the present day).
- They reject His teachings about salvation by grace through faith, rather by works or traditions and rituals.

#### Conclusion

- To God the Father, Jesus Christ is the living stone, chosen and precious.
- To the believers, Jesus is the dependable rock of salvation.
- To the unbelievers, Jesus is the rejected rock of offense that cause them to stumble.

The fact that many stumble over Christ affirms that God's truth is not based on popular acceptance. It shows that God is sovereign and unchanging.

#### Romans 9:33

As it is written: "Behold, I lay in Zion a stumbling stone and rock of offense, and whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

The question is, who is Jesus to you?

- Your chief cornerstone? Or
- A rock of offense?
