

What does it mean to be saved?

Romans 10:11-13 (NKJV)

11For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." 12For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. 13For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Introduction

- · It is not being religious.
- · It is not being called a Christian.

Romans 10:13

For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

John 3:17

For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

Three Parts of Salvation

I. Saved from the penalty of sins

Romans 3:23

for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Note

Sin is anything we do, say, or think that displeases God and breaks God's law.

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 3:23

for all have sinned and fall short of 2 Corinthians 5:21 the glory of God,

It is not just physical death but spiritual death as well.

Eternal separation from God, into the lake of fire

Revelations 20:14-15 (The Second Death)

14Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. 15And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.

Note

The reason why Jesus came is to set us free from the bondage of sin.

John 8:36

Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.

Jesus Christ was sent by the Father to be our Savior and to bring salvation to all who received Him as Lord and Savior.

John 3:16

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Jesus Christ

- He is the Son of God.
- He was born of a virgin.
- He lived a perfect, sinless life because He is God in human body.
- He died on the cross.
- He paid the penalty of our sins that we have committed against
- He took all of God's wrath on the cross for our sins.
- Jesus, who knew no sin, was made to be sin for us. Jesus took our penalty.

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

- Then, three days later, He rose from the grave, showing that God the Father had accepted His payment in your behalf.

- Jesus died so that we could be saved from the penalty of sin from God's wrath.

II. Saved from the power of sin

If we trust Jesus as our Lord and Savior

- not because you got baptized
- not because you joined a church
- not because you call yourself religious
- not because you do good deeds
- not because you are raised in a Christian home
- but because you put your faith in what Jesus did for you on the cross
- because you put your faith in Jesus alone to save you

Romans 10:13

For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."



- even if you still have struggles on it
 even if doubt might creep into your mind
- If you recognized your "sinfulness," the Bible calls this repentance.
- When you put your "faith alone" in "Jesus alone," the best you know how.
- The Bible says thou shall be saved.

III. Saved from the presence of sin

- Not only does he want us to be saved from the penalty of sin.
- If we trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord, He is saving us in this present life.
- But not only does He want to save us from the penalty of sin and the power of sin, but also someday when we are in heaven, we will be saved from the presence of sin.

And so, what does it mean to be saved? It means to recognize our sin and to put our faith alone in Jesus alone to save us from the penalty of sin, and the power and presence of sin.
