

What the Bible teaches about Election

2 Peter 1:3-11 (NKJV)

3as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. 5But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, 6to knowledge selfcontrol, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, 7to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love, 8For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 9For he who lacks these things is shortsighted, even to blindness, and has forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins. 10 Therefore, brethren, be even more diligent to make your call and election sure, for if you do these things you will never stumble; "for so an entrance will be supplied to you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Introduction

Election is a sovereign act of God in grace, whereby God chooses those who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, whom He foreknew would accept even before the foundation of the world.

- Election is a sovereign act of God.
 He does not have to consult with nor ask the opinion of anyone.
- The Scripture teaches that election took place "before the foundation of the world."

Ephesians 1:4

just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love.

- There is none with whom God could consult. All men sinned and are guilty before God. He was not in any obligation whatsoever to provide salvation to any.
- Election is "in Christ alone" because He alone can provide the righteousness.
- It is "in Christ" because He alone could provide all righteousness, which man needed. God could not choose man in Himself, so He chose him "in Christ."
- Election is always said to be according to God's foreknowledge.

Romans 8:28-30

²⁸And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. ²⁹For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. ³⁰Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.

1 Peter 1:1-2

¹Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To the pilgrims of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, ²elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ:

 Clarifying between God's foreknowledge and God's foreordained

 There is a difference between what God determines to bring to pass and what God merely permits to happen for sin to enter the universe.

 Men are not saved because they believe, but by believing.

 Believers were foreseen by God "in Christ" when he chose them through faith to His dear Son.



- The Bible does not teach selection, but election.
- Nowhere does the Bible teach that some are predestined to be damned.
- This would be unnecessary because all are sinners and on their way to eternal damnation.

Ephesians 2:1-3

'And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, 'in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, ³among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others.

Ephesians 2:12

that at that time you were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.

Note

It is not man's non-election that leads to eternal ruin. It is his sin and failure to accept and acknowledge Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior, if only man will. Not only is he invited, but is urged to do so.

- Let no idea with regard to this doctrine of election in any way hinder the preaching of the Gospel of Salvation to all humanity.
- The great commission is still the obligation of the church of Jesus Christ.

Mark 16:15-16

¹⁵And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. ¹⁶He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned.

Challenge

The Philippian Jailer Story

Acts 16:30-31

³⁰And he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹So they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household."

Note

Not because Paul did not mention repentance that it becomes unnecessary, but rather repentance is our prerequisite to salvation. Some might attempt to teach that all you need to do to be saved is just believe.

Write the points to remember from the sermon as you seek God in your life.
