



Come to Salvation

John 4:15-26 (NKJV)

15The woman said to Him, "Sir, give me this water, that I may not thirst, nor come here to draw." 16 Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." 17The woman answered and said, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You have well said. 'I have no husband,' 18 for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly." 19The woman said to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. 20Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship." 21 Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father. 22You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews. 23But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. 24God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." 29The woman said to Him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When He comes, He will tell us all things." 26 Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am He."

Introduction

How did you come to Christ?

As we are unique individuals with different personalities and backgrounds, each of us would have different stories to tell about how we met our Savior Jesus Christ.

There are identifiable elements in the story of this Samaritan woman. They are:

- Sensing our need for a Savior
- Recognizing that our sins are the

cause of our separation from God's holiness

- Realizing that we cannot hide our secrets or play games with God, who looks on our hearts
- Deciding to believe in Jesus to save us from our sins

We can discern from the story that the Samaritan woman had no interest in spiritual things at first, but through the gradual process and the unique encounter with Jesus opened the opportunity for the gospel.

To drink of this living water of salvation you must:
a. acknowledge your needs
b. confess your sins to God
c. submit yourself before Him
d. and believe in Jesus for who He is

A. Acknowledge your needs. (v. 15)

In John 4:13-14, Jesus tells the woman, "Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life."

The world and the things in the world might quench your thirst for a short time, but you will get thirsty again. But when you drink of the water of salvation that Jesus gives, you are satisfied!

Even if you did not completely understand what that living water was, but if you want to drink the living water of salvation, you must acknowledge your need for God, even if you're not totally clear about what salvation means.

Saying, "I can do it," will not bring you to Jesus. You must recognize that you have needs that only God can satisfy.

B. Confess your sins to God. (v. 16-19)

If Jesus had simply given her the living water at this point, she would have been a superficial believer because something crucial was missing. So, Jesus abruptly changed direction.

He said to her, "Go, call your husband and come here." The woman answered and said, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You have correctly said, 'I have no husband'; for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; this you have said truly." The woman said to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet."

This is an example of Jesus, the Light, shining in the darkness and exposing the evil deeds of this woman. He did it to show her that her real need was spiritual, not material. He was helping her come to terms with the nature of the gift that He was offering. Only a sick person needs a cure. Only a sinner needs a savior.



No matter how you hide your sins, God knew your sins and you must acknowledge and confess your sins to God. Jesus did not die on the cross just to give you a happy life. He died on the cross to pay the penalty for your sins.

To come to Him for salvation, you must realize that you are a guilty sinner. Like the prodigal son, you have to say (Luke 15:21), "Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight!"

C. Submit yourself before Him. (v. 20-24)

John 4:20-24: Our fathers worshiped in this mountain, and you people say that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship." Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, an hour is coming when neither in this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But an hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for such people the Father seeks to be His worshipers. God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

In the context, Jesus is making the point that outward religious rituals and ceremonies are not at the heart of salvation. Eternal life is a matter of knowing and worshiping the living God on the heart level. As Jesus told Nicodemus (John 3:6), "That which

is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." We must be born of the Spirit to worship God in spirit. But at the same time, worship is not just an internal matter based on your own feelings. Worship must also be in line with the truth.

Jesus twice repeats, true worshipers must worship the Father "in spirit and in truth," where "spirit" here refers to the human spirit, which is the immaterial part of our being. Of course, we worship through the Holy Spirit, who imparts new life to us (John 3:6) and dwells within us. We can only worship God in spirit when the Holy Spirit has caused us to be born again.

To worship God in spirit means to worship Him with complete sincerity, not with outward show or profession when our hearts are far from Him (Mark 7:6-7). To worship God in truth means to worship Him as He has revealed Himself to us in His Word. If you worship God as you conceive Him to be, apart from the truth of His Word, you are worshiping an idol, a figment of your imagination.

He is the way, the truth, and the life; no one can come to the Father, except through Him (John 14:6). If we have seen Him, we have seen the Father (John 14:9). To worship God in truth is to worship Him in accordance with how He has revealed Himself in His Word

D. Believe in Jesus for who He is. (v. 25-26)

John 4:25-26: "The woman said to Him, 'I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when that One comes, He will declare all things to us.' Jesus said to her, 'I who speak to you am He.'"


She recognized that when the Messiah came, He would resolve all these issues. The Samaritans believed that the coming Prophet would declare all things (Deuteronomy 18:15).

We must believe in Jesus as the Bible reveals Him: He is the eternal God, creator of all that is, who took on human flesh, and died as the supreme and final sacrifice for our sins. He was buried, risen from the dead, and exalted on high. To deny either His true deity or humanity is to believe in a false Christ.

Jesus told this woman that the Father is seeking those who will worship Him in spirit and in truth.

Jesus was seeking this sinful, confused, emotionally wounded woman so that she would become one who would worship the Father in spirit and in truth.

Jesus is seeking you, too, as one who will worship Him in spirit and in truth. To drink the living water of salvation, acknowledge your need to God; confess your sins to Him; submit yourself before Him; and believe in Jesus for who He is, the only Sayior, the Christ of God.
