

Believed (Belief) to Believed (Faith)

John 4:46-53 (NKJV)

46So Jesus came again to Cana of Galilee where He had made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman whose son was sick at Capernaum. 47When he heard that Jesus had come out of Judea into Galilee, he went to Him and implored Him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. 48Then Jesus said to him, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will by no means believe." 49The nobleman said to Him, "Sir, come down before my child dies!" 50 Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your son lives." So the man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way. 51And as he was now going down, his servants met him and told him, saving, "Your son lives!" 52Then he inquired of them the hour when he got better. And they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." 53So the father knew that it was at the same hour in which Jesus said to him, "Your son lives." And he himself believed, and his whole household.

Introduction

I remember watching a movie and the scene is like this, a soldier with his team rushed in the war zone. Bullets were everywhere; soldiers were taking bullets one after the other. Then, one guy hid behind a boulder and he said, "God, get me out of here safely and I will serve you for the rest of my life!" Then, the war ended, and he safely got through the battle.

The man believed in God that was why he prayed. We can say that God heard his prayer because he believed. However, the real test is not during the battle but after the pressure is off. Will he forget God and go back to his old ways? Or, will he go deeper and develop genuine faith in the person of Christ that is not just a response to his immediate need? Will he repent of his sins, trust in Christ as his Savior, and follow Him as Lord after his crisis is over?

A. Desperate Cry

Life always has two sides of stories. The first is filled with joy and happiness; but the second is filled with sickness, desperation, anxiety, and death. It is like the two sides of the same coin.

John mentioned that Jesus came again to Cana, where He made the water wine. There was a nobleman whose son was sick. When he heard that Jesus is coming to Galilee, from Capernaum, he travelled around 20 kilometers on foot just to meet Jesus and implored Him to come and heal his son. Maybe he had consulted several physicians as he was a nobleman, but to no avail. Now, his son was about to die. He was desperate!

God often uses the crises in our lives to get us to seek Him in ways that we never would have done if the crisis had not occurred. But we need to understand that seeking the Lord in a crisis is not automatic. Many curse God and grow bitter when trials hit. We should follow this man's example by seeking the Lord when trouble strikes.

Jesus knew that the nobleman was not there seeking forgiveness and eternal life. He was not there to follow Him or be His disciple. He was there because he was in desperate need.

So, Jesus rebuked him saying, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will by no means believe."

v. 48-49 - ⁴⁸Then Jesus said to him, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will by no means believe." ⁴⁹The nobleman said to Him, "Sir, come down before my child dies!"

This rebuke was addressed to both the man and the Galileans who were there. Jesus' rebuke was intended to help them see their greater need, the salvation of their souls.

Many of us come to God and cry for help when we are in a desperate situation. We expect God to immediately answer our prayers like a genie in a lamp. After our prayers were answered and the difficulties had passed, we immediately have an





v. 50 - Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your son lives." So, the man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way.

This man had a preconceived idea on how the Lord must work to solve his problem. Like many of us, we also have our own thoughts on how God will resolve our problems. We want to solve it our way. But, Jesus answered his plea to help him develop his belief.

When the man said, "Come before my child dies!" Jesus said, "Go, your son lives." Ibelieve that Jesus did that to force the man to believe without a sign. Jesus requires a deeper faith.

Note

The Lord answered the man's desire (to heal his son), but not his request (to come down to his house). So, the man had to put aside his expectations of how Jesus would work and just take Him at His word.

The nobleman believed Jesus' word and he demonstrated his faith by going home.

C. Saving Faith (holding on to Jesus' words)

v. 51-53 - 51 And as he was now going down, his servants met him and told him, saying, "Your son lives!" 52 Then he inquired of them the hour when he got better. And they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." 53 So the father knew that it was at the same hour in which Jesus said to him, "Your son lives."

And he himself believed, and his whole household.

The following day, as he was on the way home, his slaves met him with the wonderful news that his son was living. The man was no doubt overjoyed, but he wanted to make sure that this wasn't just a coincidence. So, he asked them at what hour "he began to get better." They replied (4:52), "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him."

The man then knew that it was the same hour when Jesus had spoken the word, "Your son lives." As a result, the man and his entire household believed in Jesus

He has grown from the belief when he sought Christ to get him out of a crisis, to the stronger faith of taking Christ at His word, to this mature faith in Jesus for who He is, the Christ, the Son of God.

The result is that he and his family recognized that Jesus was no ordinary prophet, but one who can speak the word and heal at a distance. He is God in human flesh.

Conclusion

Realistically, God doesn't often give us immediate answers to our requests, as Jesus did to this man. But even then, we must trust that He has a good reason for His delays and that He waits for our good.

How often I expect God to answer in my way and my timing? But when He doesn't, I doubt His love or His care.

We need to trust God in His time and His way.
