Romans 8:18-25 (NKJV)

¹⁸For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. 19For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it in hope; ²¹because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. ²²For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now. ²³Not only that, but we also who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of our body. ²⁴For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not see, we eagerly wait for it with perseverance.

Introduction

Why do negative things happen in one's life?

1. The present time is marked by sufferings because of man's fall into sin.

Romans 8:19-22 (NKJV)

¹⁹For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it in hope; ²¹because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. ²²For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now.

a. The whole creation suffers because of man's fall into sin.

Genesis 3:17-19 (NKJV)

¹⁷Then to Adam He said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it': "Cursed is the ground for your sake; In toil you shall eat of it All the days of your life. ¹⁸Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you, And you shall eat the herb of the field. ¹⁹In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread Till you return to the ground, For out of it you were taken; For dust you are, And to dust you shall return."

b. Even believers are not exempted from these sufferings.

- d. The fact of suffering does not undermine the fact that God has a plan and that He will accomplish His plan.

b. The future glory includes the full renewal of creation to its original perfection and purpose.

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)

- c. The future glory includes our freedom from sin and its corruption, including the full redemption of our bodies.

d. The future glory is guaranteed by our present possession of the Holy Spirit, the first fruits of our redemption.

Romans 8:25 (NKJV)


