



Who is Jesus Christ?

John 7:1-13 (NKJV)

¹After these things Jesus walked in Galilee; for He did not want to walk in Judea, because the Jews sought to kill Him. 2Now the Jews' Feast of Tabernacles was at hand. ³His brothers therefore said to Him, "Depart from here and go into Judea, that Your disciples also may see the works that You are doing. 4For no one does anything in secret while he himself seeks to be known openly. If You do these things, show Yourself to the world." 5For even His brothers did not believe in Him. 6Then Jesus said to them, "My time has not yet come, but your time is always ready. 7The world cannot hate you, but it hates Me because I testify of it that its works are evil. 8You go up to this feast. I am not yet going up to this feast, for My time has not yet fully come." 9When He had said these things to them, He remained in Galilee. 10 But when His brothers had gone up, then He also went up to the feast, not openly, but as it were in secret. 11Then the Jews sought Him at the feast, and said, "Where is He?" 12And there was much complaining among the people concerning Him. Some said, "He is good"; others said, "No, on the contrary, He deceives the people." 13However, no one spoke openly of Him for fear of the Jews.

Introduction

We are living in the days where anyone can easily hear about Jesus Christ. Buy sadly, many still do not know who He is. And if a person does not really know Jesus, then how can that person trust in Him as Lord and Savior? He could be believing in a Jesus of his own imagination. Even Christians who already believed in Jesus need to grow in the knowledge and in relationship with Jesus.

Philippians 3:7-10

⁷But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. 8Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ 9and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith; 10that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,

The more deeply we know Jesus Christ for who He is, the more we will submit to Him as the Lord of our every thought, word, and deed, and the more readily we will trust Him in all the daily matters of our lives. It is because believing in Jesus for salvation depends on knowing Him for who He is.

Our text reveals to us some wrong views about Jesus that the Jewish people, including Jesus' own brothers, had about Him.

A. The wrong views about Jesus - Unbelieving view

The brothers of Jesus gave Him some unsolicited advice:

vv. 3-4 - 3His brothers therefore said to Him, "Depart from here and go into Judea, that Your disciples also may see the works that You are doing. 4For no one does anything in secret while he himself seeks to be known openly. If You do these things, show Yourself to the world."

After the turning of event in John 6:66 (From that time many of His disciples

went back and walked with Him no more.) Jesus, once popular, now was losing disciples. His brothers were saying, "You want your disciples to be back, go to Jerusalem, do some miracles" or "If you want Your Messianic claims to be made known, You need to go prove Yourself to the religious authorities in the capital city."

It may sound good, but clearly it is a worldly advice rooted in worldly wisdom, practical with human reasoning.

The brothers' advice to Jesus was similar to the temptation that Satan put before Jesus to jump off the pinnacle of the temple and let the angels carry Him safely to the ground so that everyone who saw it would be astonished and bow before Him as the Son of God (Matthew 4:5-7; Luke 4:5-8).

Like the brothers of Jesus. thev have known Jesus since they were young. They grew up together and heard His teaching, and knew that He performed many miracles yet still be unbelieving.

PEAC is represented nationally by its National Secretariat and in each region by its Regional Secretariats.

What is Contracting (ESC)

Education Service Contracting (ESC) is a partnership program by the Department of Education (DepEd) aimed at decongesting overcrowded public junior high schools. In ESC, the excess capacities of certified private junior high schools are "contracted" through slot allocations for students who would otherwise have gone to public schools. The slots come with subsidies called ESC grants, and program beneficiaries are called ESC grantees or, for the purposes of these guidelines, simply grantees.

- Elementary graduate from a DepEd public school or DepEd-recognized private school
- Filipino & Incoming Grade 7 student
- Has not been a recipient of the ESC in previous school years

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Who is Jesus...

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We can grow up in a Christian home, or even go to church regularly and have read the Bible, but still we do not really believe in Him as Lord and Savior.

- Hostile view

v. 11 - Then the Jews sought Him at the feast, and said, "Where is He?"

The Jewish leaders were seeking Him, but not so they could learn from Him, but so they could kill Him. Jesus' teaching opposed them and challenged their authority. Jesus did not follow their traditions (He performed healing during Sabbath); He upset the vendors at the temple (their income was damaged); and He rebuked them in front of many people (their pride was damaged). Because of this, even if miracles happened in front of them, they would not think rationally or would even listen to His teaching as to search the scripture. They reacted emotionally because their comfortable way of life was compromised.

Even many church-goers stop following Christ when their way of life is touched. Instead of thinking rationally, they reacted emotionally. Maybe they sensed that to come to Christ would mean the end of their plans, their prestige, and their control over their lives.

John 10:10h

I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

- Mixed view

v. 12 - Some said, "He is good"; others said, "No, on the contrary, He deceives the people."

Some viewed Jesus as a good man because they benefited (healing, miracles), while some viewed Him as a deceiver of people because Jesus claimed to be the Messiah, the Son of God. But none of them really believed in Jesus. Why?

It was because Jesus confronted their sins (v. 7). Also, they were hesitant because they feared their religious leaders. They did not want to be branded as Jesus' disciples yet still showed up when Jesus came to their cities to be healed or to see miracles.

To be a disciple of Jesus means to follow Jesus' teachings.

John 15:18-19

¹⁸⁴If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. ¹⁹If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you.

Your popularity will become hatred because they will see you as a better person than them (a new creation). You cannot blend into the world any longer because you will become the salt and the light of the world. So, if you want to cover up your sins and blend in with the world, you will not truly believe in Jesus.

James 4:4

Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

B. The only saving view of Jesus

- Jesus is the Messiah.

Jesus is the Lamb of God, slaughtered for our sake, and His death would bring salvation to those who believed.

- Jesus is Lord.

John 6:68-69

⁶⁸But Simon Peter answered Him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹Also we have come to believe and know that You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

James 1:1a

James, a bondservant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ,

Jude 1:1a

Jude, a bondservant of Jesus Christ, and brother of James.

Romans 1:1a

Paul, a bondservant of Jesus Christ,

Conclusion

First, if you grew up in the church and have been familiar with Christian teaching all your life, do not be fooled into thinking that you are saved by your familiarity with Jesus. If Jesus' own brothers were not saved by their connection, it shows that no one is saved by familiarity alone. You must personally believe in Him as your Savior from sin, the one who bore your penalty on the cross.

Second, if you have believed in

Christ, you must let Him confront your sin so that you forsake it and walk in the light. Through God's Word, Jesus tells us how to think, to speak, and to act in a godly way. If you are not letting the Word confront your sins, you are not walking with Jesus.

Finally, if you believe in Jesus as Lord and Savior, you must be at war with the world. You are either a friend of the world and an enemy of God or a friend of God and an enemy of the world. As John wrote (1 John 2:15), "Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him."









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
